



## Bush Pushes Immigration Bill

On Tuesday, May 29, 2007, President Bush discussed a bipartisan immigration bill at the Federal Law Enforcement Training Center in Glynco, GA. Bush hopes the bill will help stifle illegal immigration, as well as "give temporary legal status to millions of unlawful immigrants, provided they came forward, paid a fine, and underwent criminal background checks," states an article on [www.news.yahoo.com](http://www.news.yahoo.com).



The article goes on to say that immigrants seeking a green card would also have to "pay another fine, learn English, return to their home country, and wait in line. The plan also would create a guest worker program. It would allow foreign laborers to come to the U.S. for

temporary stints, yet with no guarantee they can eventually gain citizenship."

At the Training Center, Bush asked skeptical Americans who don't believe the government can fix the problem to "give us a chance to fix the problems in a comprehensive way that enforces our border and treats people with decency and respect. Give us a chance to fix this problem. Don't try to kill this bill before it gets moving."
